Objectives and activities

The Objects of the charity are to promote any charitable purpose for improving and developing the artistic creative talent of the young people aged 8 to 26, in particular but not limited to financing coaching in the Arts and any other activity which the trustees see fit in pursuit of the organisation's purposes, including mentoring, performance opportunities and the promotion of equality and good mental health through access to the Arts for those that would not be able to afford under normal circumstances.

Campden Edge's geographical limits are defined as the district of Campden Vale and the surrounding villages of Blockley, Paxford, Stretton on Fosse, Pebworth, Honeybourne & Aston Magna; and including current and past pupils of Campden Schools who fall outside the areas defined above.

Our main activity is to raise funds via local publicity and collection boxes. We also receive monies from individual donors, local groups, and other charitable trusts. We are all volunteers and we aim to keep overheads to a minimum so that the majority of money raised can go towards supporting individual applicants and schools.

Volunteer and committee member, Sara Wright, runs the Schools Support scheme whereby the schools (7 primary and one secondary) in our catchment area can apply for funding for arts based extra curricula trips to support students whose family cannot afford to pay for the cost of a trip or event. The grant is capped on school size and was limited to a total of £1050 across the 8 schools for the year. Sara has provided the following report.

Schools have been contacted periodically during lockdown. This has ensured schools are aware of the scheme, and to remind them

of Campden Edge and what resources we can provide.

Unfortunately many planned arts trips we would normal fund were cancelled. However one primary school purchased tickets for a workshop/performance via the internet which illustrates how the Arts are rethinking their reach. This scheme helped 9 children between the ages of 4 -10. Although this application included children under the age of 8, the Committee unanimously agreed this one off grant to support the mental well being of the pupils. Chipping Campden School also successfully applied for a grant to support an increasing number of Pupil Premium students they have with set text English books.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

We received £16,090 in the Year Ending 5 April 2021 – up £7,030 on last year. We are extremely pleased with this result especially as both the Music and Literature Festivals were cancelled and the Campden Open Gardens was a virtual rather than a physical event.

The biggest donation of £7000 was from the closure of the town's social club. The Braithwaite Club. We also received support from the Blockley Arts Society £800, the RL Trust £500, the Campden Rotary Club £500, and the GMCA £2000.

We received just over £1,600 from Campden's Virtual Open Gardens; along with proceeds from Rachel Cunynghame's Plant Sales of a further £1500. An extra source of income this year was the volunteer Newspaper Delivery round organised by Mark and Donna Evans during the Covid Lock Down. People receiving deliveries were asked to give money to ourselves or Campden Home Nursing. A further £900 was raised from their efforts.

Ros Young, who was a long standing supporter of the charity, unfortunately died this year. We were honoured to be nominated for her funeral collection which raised a further £530. In addition the charity has collection boxes across the area which brought in a total of £220.

Due to the pandemic, arts teaching was considerably reduced so our total payments were down by 55% or £5,300.

The charity made grants of £4,400 to pay for arts education for 16 individual students (as opposed to £9,700 for 31 students last year).

Schools Support

We also gave a total of £2,528 - supporting financially disadvantaged pupils' contribution school organised activities.

This included a grant towards a workshop/and performance via the internet for one local primary school. Chipping Campden School also were granted money for English set texts. This supported Pupil Premium students whose family would struggle to afford them.

The charity runs a small virtual instrument library where unwanted instruments can be placed with students
